- Newton C. Fetter Award to an individual for significant innovation in campus ministry.

## *Dr. Robert Webber Interviewed by Christianity Today* *on "A Call to an Ancient Evangelical Future"*

This article is from Northern Baptist Theological Seminary.

Dr. Robert Webber, Myers Chair of Ministry at Northern Baptist Theological Seminary, was recently interviewed by *Christianity Today's* Vice President, David Neff, for the September 2006 issue of *Christianity Today*. During the interview, Webber was asked about the recent document he crafted with the input and editing of leading evangelicals across the country. "A Call to an

Ancient Evangelical Future" is an appeal to evangelical leaders to resist conforming themselves to the "current cultural milieu and the resurgence of religious and political ideologies." The document also resists "evangelicals' accommodation to civil religion, rationalism, privatism and pragmatism," and insists that "God's story" is the single interpretive narrative by which the church must live.

This is not the first time that Webber has been in the spotlight for a document of this nature. Thirty years ago, he and a group of colleagues produced "The Chicago Call: An Appeal to Evangelicals." The document addressed a number of issues assailing the church and recommended the development of a church-wide historical identity. *Christianity Today* commended "The Call" and published its text in full. *Newsweek* magazine, however, devoted its entire religion section to it. One thing is clear: Webber's call turned the church's attention back to the early church.

## *Learn How to Get Visitors "Beyond the First Visit" and Incorporate them into the Ministry of the Church*

*Beyond the First Visit* is specifically geared for pastors and church leaders who routinely ask the questions: "What's the best way to attract new people to our church?"; "How do we welcome those who come?"; "What's the best method for following-up with new people?" In addition to answering these questions, *Beyond the First Visit* will show how being friendly accounts for only 20% of a church's effectiveness in welcoming guests—80% comes from well-designed systems.

Dr. Gary McIntosh, a well known author, speaker and consultant on strengthening churches, will lead the seminar at Northern Seminary, September 18, 2006 in the Lindner Conference Center from 9:00 am – 4:00 pm. The one-day event is sponsored by The Grow Center for Church Leadership.

*Beyond the First Visit* is open to pastors and church leaders involved in welcoming and connecting ministries. Greeters and those involved in guest follow up will particularly find the conference helpful as well as all persons working in the areas of assimilation, member involvement, and guest services.

Gary McIntosh is a professor, consultant, author and speaker as well as the President of the Church Growth Network. He is also the professor of Christian Ministry and Leadership at Talbot School of Theology at Biola University in California. Over the years, he has helped more than 500 churches of 55 different Christian denominations. He is the author of 13 books on church growth and six manuals on pastoral ministry as well as the editor of *Church Growth Network & Journal of American Church Growth*. Gary is listed in the "Who's Who" in church growth.

## Ministers Council News

### *Ministers Council Awards Marwin McMickle for Excellence In Ministry*

VALLEY FORGE, PA (ABNS 8/16/06)—Ministers Council President Alice Davis has selected the Rev. Dr. Marwin A. McMickle as recipient of the 2006 Ralph Garfield Schell Presidential Award for Excellence in Ministry. The award was announced at the concluding banquet of the Ministers Council Senate on August 15.

McMickle has served as the Pastor of the Antioch Baptist Church in Cleveland, Ohio, since 1987. During that time the church has thrived and become one of the most influential African-American congregations in the city. Antioch has pioneered an AIDS prevention and treatment program with special focus on the African-American community. In addition to its traditional Sunday morning worship service, the church has instituted Saturday evening and early Sunday morning services using alternate formats that are reaching new generations and communities of people for Christ. The Antioch Baptist Church is among the leaders in American Baptist Mission Support. Last year the church placed second among the thirty-eight Cleveland Baptist Association (CBA) congregations in ABMS. Antioch was a leading contributor to both tsunami and hurricane relief efforts last year, and consistently participates in all four national ABC offerings. McMickle is currently serving as a member of the CBA Board of Trustees and the CBA Department of Ministry and he also chairs the CBA Department of Metropolitan Ministries.

McMickle is one of the most accomplished preachers in the nation. He serves as professor of preaching at Ashland Theological Seminary and will be the Bible Study leader for the 2007 Central Sectional Black Church Education Conference in Columbus.

McMickle is well-known to American Baptists as a prolific and insightful author. He has authored six books for Judson Press in the past six years, including the most recent release of [The Star Book on Preaching](#). Rebecca Irwin-Diehl of Judson Press commented on his selection, "It's always an honor for Judson to support the Ralph Garfield Schell Presidential Award, and this year it's particularly gratifying given that the recipient is our own Marwin A. McMickle, one of our best-selling authors in recent years. For his scholarship, his preaching ministry, and for his Christian character, we celebrate him as the 2006 winner." His newest title, *This Far by Faith: An African American History for Youth*, is scheduled to release in December of this year.

The President's Award was instituted in 1996, and called The Ralph Garfield Schell Prize. The award is named for Ralph Garfield Schell, who addressed the Northern Baptist Convention on June 22, 1935, in Colorado Springs, speaking on the theme, *A Revitalized Ministry*. It is the annual recognition of a member of a local Ministers Council who seems to be extraordinarily faithful in carrying out the principles of the Ministers Council Code of Ethics. In recognition of the award he will receive a book certificate from Judson Press and his name will be added to the plaque of recipients in the Ministers Council office at the Mission Center.

## *Practicing Our Faith Grant*

For the second time, the Ministers Council of Valley Forge has been awarded a \$10,000 Valparaiso Project Practicing Our Faith grant. The previous Valparaiso Project grant in the 2002 and 2003 program year funded monthly luncheon gatherings for leaders who manage numerous responsibilities and heavy travel schedules, on the faith practice of honoring the body.

## *Update on Darfur*

This article is from Church World Service (CWS).

**Sudan**--Thirty community and faith leaders from the Equatoria region of southern Sudan, recently participated in a six-day Strategies in Trauma Awareness and Resiliency (STAR) training at the regional ecumenical center in Maridi, Sudan. The workshop, which was hosted by CWS and partner the New Sudan Council of Churches, will help to strengthen local peace initiatives in the south's devastated communities.

The facilitation team included two trainers from Eastern Mennonite University, as well as CWS International Disaster Response and Recovery Liaison Ivan DeKam. CWS and the New Sudan Council of Churches are planning additional STAR workshops in Sudan.

Since the January 2005 signing of a peace agreement that ended a 21-year-long war in southern Sudan, CWS has been helping partners in the region as they assist families returning to their homes. The STAR training is part of the CWS strategy to help bring peace back to the region.

CWS is also supporting the work of partners in the Darfur region of western Sudan, as they provide water, seeds, training, a school and school materials, a clinic, and social programs for uprooted families in the region.
